

Writing an AI Policy

You have just been hired by EMCC's Writing Success Center, but they are currently overhauling many of their policies. They want to have a clearer statement on how ENG101 students should (and should not) be using AI in their writing. Your first order of business is to work with a small team of other student-tutors to develop a clear and succinct policy regarding AI in college writing.

Subject

Your group can decide what the appropriate uses of AI in writing are. Concepts should be based on the readings provided, including the Habits of Mind.

Audience

Your audience is ENG101 students at EMCC. These are students with a wide range of experiences, both in their use of AI and their confidence in their writing skills.

Purpose

You are giving students guidance on how to navigate this controversial technology, while respecting the academic integrity of the college. Keep in mind that some students will be completely resistant to AI, while others will want to use it to write for them completely. Your team will need to decide what is most appropriate for building writing skills, using emerging technology, and respecting the institution.

Process

1. Reflect on the purpose of writing
2. Read about AI in writing classes
3. Discuss ideas with group
4. Prewrite
5. Draft
6. Revise with group
7. Edit and publish
8. Reflect

Key Features

Educational policies include key features that you will need to address.

- A clear statement of what is and is not allowed
- Explanation of reasons
- Support from other resources
- Sometimes: visual aids, graphics, lists

Other Requirements

- 250 words minimum (500 maximum)
- MLA Format or a format that you decide will be better for this particular style of writing with instructor-approval
