

### **Quality:**

- Provides a platform for faculty to share ideas and best practices regarding the assessment of student learning and effective active learning activities.
- Documents effective practices.
- The "CATS of the Month" feature allows the Student Academic Achievement Committee (SAAC) to promote those CATS forms that are of the highest quality to all EMCC employees ("CATS of the Month" awardees earn a special coffee cup delivered to their office).
- Even the CATS system itself is **designed with quality improvements** in mind; since the launch in Fall 2012, **multiple edits** have already been made to the system to reflect what users communicated they desire most from their experience, thereby enhancing a **cycle of continual improvement.**

## **Efficiency:**

- Like Facebook, designed with ease and minimal time investment for users.
- Little training needed for participants.
- Anyone at any time can go onto the website and review all CATS forms (even those outside the organization).
- Within a couple of clicks of the mouse, **CATS forms can be filtered** and **sorted** by **division**, by **time** of posting, or by **type of assessment**.
- The **advanced search feature** within the CATS system allows users to pinpoint exact forms within seconds.
- It is now possible for a user to **find all assessments** related to a specific topic of interest **instantaneously**.





### **Cost Effectiveness:**

- Uses Free Open Source Software (FOSS) no technology cost.
- The value of sharing best teaching and assessment practices across disciplines and divisions is enormous.
- The **monetary cost** of **maintaining** this innovation is virtually nonexistent.
- There are **no licensing fees** associated with this product because it was developed "in-house" using the skills of Maricopa employees.
- CATS is a standalone installation of the existing information technology platform, the **EMCC** website.
- It was developed within the regular work duties of existing employees without any need for auxiliary contracts.

## **Replication:**

- Right now, any college in Maricopa can access the CATS website.
- CATS can readily be replicated in other institutions in a day or less.
- With our blueprints and trial-and-error experiences, it should take little time and effort to **implement** this system across other district colleges that use the Drupal system.
- What's ours is yours.





## **Creativity:**

- The system is a **complete reimaging** of the way that faculty and staff approach **documenting and sharing best teaching, assessment,** and **learning practices**.
- CATS was built on the premise that good ideas need to be spread in a user-friendly manner.
- The comments section acts as an asynchronous conversation about good teaching and assessment practices.
- Users can find high quality, peer-reviewed CATS forms both through user ratings as well as through the more formal recognition of the "CATS of the Month" awards.
- The ability to **search for key words** within the **CATS** system creates new ways for users to find and analyze others' forms. The genesis of this innovation was **purely employee-driven** and **from their own creativity**.
- It has an immeasurable potential to change the way best teaching and learning practices are shared within a college or across a spectrum of colleges.

### **Timeliness:**

- **Development** began in Academic Year 2011-12.
- **Prototype** developed during Summer 2012.
- Officially **launched** in Fall 2012.
- As of today, over 50 unique CATS forms have been submitted to the system, representing all 9 divisions of the college.





# **Learning:**

- The **central purpose** of the CATS system is to spread **best practices** to **improve student learning**.
- In other words, when **Faculty Members learn**, the **students learn**. **CATS** is all about **Faculty learning** so they can **optimize student learning**.
- Faculty and staff have benefited from the best practices shared by their colleagues.
  - "Love this idea... I will implement a version of this with my CHM152 research projects this semester."
  - o "This is what CATS is about! Try something out, learn from it, make adjustments, and then do it again with modifications. And then . . . SHARE your results."
  - "After reading over your plan, I am eager to take my final presentation and correlate that with how my students fair when aligning their progress to the learning outcomes for my ENG101, 102 and 091 courses!"

### **Collaboration:**

- The **features** of the **CATS** system were the **brainchild of many faculty** members and **staff** who gave **valuable input** into desired features and abilities.
- There was **collaboration** between the **SAAC co-chairs** and staff of EMCC's **Information Technology** division.
- Once the system was up, **suggestions for modifications** could be made and accepted from **anyone** in the college.
- The CATS system itself is based on collaboration, where good teaching and assessment practices are shared with the college and the community.
- Other people collaborate by giving feedback, suggestions, and ideas to further a best practice. The system allows good ideas to spread throughout the college based on collaboration.
- In short, **CATS** was **created in, modified through**, and is all about sharing best practices in a **venue of perpetual collaboration**.
- CATS is OF, BY, and THROUGH ... COLLABORATION.
